Chief Papagni is unique in the state because he is not elected. In 1977 supervisors passed a resolution stripping the sheriff of the responsibility of managing the jail.

Lou and Tyler (our 25 year old son) are going along this trip to not only be amazed by all that has been done in Bosnia for the last 15 years but imagine their joy and the joy of those waiting to finally meet after only seeing pictures of each other these last 15 years. Lou will be strictly "down to mission business" as he will only have 10 days in which to meet hundreds of people and help with delivery of the 500 pounds of goods we are taking but also will help in the buying of food, wood, home materials, etc. I am so looking forward to having those familiar muscles along with me this time to help. We have our transportation lined up with two available drivers at our disposal at no cost (unfortunately with non air conditioned vehicles) and our project plan is pages long in helping with food, home repairs, medicine, clothing and shoes, and little extras like toys and joys that make the children feel special. Objective: meet as many needs as time and money allow and meet the greater need day and night of sitting and listening, sharing and caring, going and showing that helping others is where life's true joy lives. The 20 days that I am there will be full and long and any time you might think of us, please pray for our endurance and safety. Lou will return after 12 days as work does not permit him to stay the full three weeks. It has taken hundreds of people all these years to make this all work but I will never forget that it has been Rotary that has believed in this effort from day one and Rotary that has consistently supported year after year.
